

10 Louisville and County Seniors Named Winners of \$1,000 Merit Scholarships

Ten Louisville and Jefferson County high school seniors have been awarded \$1,000 scholarships under the National Merit Scholarship Program.

They were among 1,000 winners in the nation and among 15 in Kentucky.

The \$1,000 scholarships are one of three types given under the program. Winners of four-year scholarships provided by private organizations were announced earlier this month. Winners of four-year scholarships awarded by colleges and universities will be announced in early May.

The type of scholarship announced today consists of a single payment of \$1,000 made after the winner has enrolled in college.

Scholarship winners qualify by taking competitive examinations. Of about 710,000 students who took the original tests, about 15,000 finalists were named. From those, the winners were chosen according to requirements set up by the individual sponsors of the scholarships.

The announcement stressed that the awards are given to individuals and should not be used to compare or judge schools.

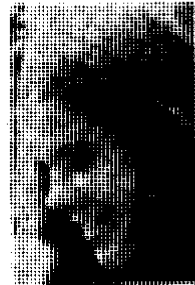
The area winners are:
